Recommendation to Reopen Chicago Police Department Disciplinary Investigation

Pursuant to the Municipal Code of Chicago (MCC) § 2-56-230(c)(ii), the Public Safety section of the City of Chicago Office of Inspector General (OIG) conducts reviews of individual closed disciplinary investigations conducted by the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) and the Chicago Police Department's (CPD) Bureau of Internal Affairs (BIA). Based on those reviews, OIG may make a recommendation to reopen the investigation to address a deficiency materially affecting its outcome.¹

COPA conducted a preliminary investigation concerning allegations that unknown CPD members used excessive force by improperly pulling the complainant's hair and carrying them by their arms and legs. COPA determined that due to a lack of cooperation from the complainant and a lack of sufficient evidence of misconduct, no CPD member would be served allegations, and the investigation was administratively closed.

In the notes section of CPD's case management system (CMS), COPA wrote, "Obtained and uploaded BWC from both witness officers. BWC did not capture incident." However, OIG's review of the same video footage found that a CPD member's body worn camera (BWC) did capture the incident. OIG recommended that COPA reopen the investigation to identify the unknown CPD member and address the excessive force allegations to include the pulling of the complainant's hair.

In response to OIG's recommendations, COPA reopened the investigation, interviewed the witness CPD members, who "could not identify [the] unknown accused officer," and closed the investigation, citing insufficient evidence to serve allegations.

OIG's letter to COPA containing its recommendations is attached in Appendix A. COPA response is attached as Appendix B.

Dear Chief Administrator Kersten:

Pursuant to § 2-56-230(c)(ii) of the Municipal Code of Chicago (MCC), the Office of Inspector General's (OIG) Public Safety section has conducted a preliminary review of the investigation conducted by the Civilian Office of Police Accountability (COPA) in Log #2024-0006026. OIG recommends that COPA reopen the investigation to account for available evidence and fully address all appropriate allegations. Log #2024-0006026 is currently in a Closed/No Finding status.

Log #2024-0006026 concerns allegations that unknown Chicago Police Department (CPD) members used excessive force by improperly pulling the complainant's dreadlocks and carrying them by their arms and legs.¹

According to the Investigatory Stop Report (ISR) in COPA's investigative file, on July 1, 2024, several CPD members were assigned to work at the Chicago Pride Parade. Officers Aaron Boyd, Star #12607, and Sarah Abuosba, Star #3003, reported that as other officers were attempting to stop a battery in progress, the complainant obstructed the officers from carrying out their duties and the complainant was subsequently detained. Officer Boyd wrote, "[complainant] related to officers [they were] attempting to aid in breaking up the fight, but upon Director of News Affairs, Ahern's further investigation via 19's District available POD footage, it revealed above listed was obstruction." The complainant was released shortly after being detained and was given an ISR receipt.

Officer Boyd's body-worn camera (BWC) footage, at the 0:04 mark, shows Officer Boyd approaching a metal barricade where several other CPD members are standing. Once Officer Boyd is standing at the barricade, a heavy set, bald male officer grabs the complainant by their dreadlocks with his left hand and pushes the complainant's head downward toward the barricade

as another officer has a grip on the complainant's right hand. Several CPD members grab the complainant by their clothing, arms and legs and carry them away from the crowd.³

In its Non-Final Summary Report, COPA concluded that due to a lack of cooperation from the complainant during its preliminary investigation, and the lack of sufficient evidence of misconduct based on COPA's review of the ISR and BWC footage, no CPD member would be served allegations. In the Notes section of CMS, COPA wrote, "Obtained and uploaded BWC from both witness officers. BWC did not capture incident." However, Officer Boyd's BWC does capture the incident starting at the 0:04 mark.

Based on OIG's preliminary review, OIG recommends that COPA reopen Log #2024-0006026 to identify the unknown CPD member and address the excessive force allegations to include the pulling of the complainant's hair.


